It's a pleasure to invite you and your companions to join a legal-study tour to Peru that departs Miami airport, Florida on January 10, 2012. We will visit the most fascinating and important places in that colorful and strangely mysterious land. Visits and meetings with Peruvian lawyers are scheduled for those attending the CLE program, which will provide an excellent opportunity to exchange ideas and compare the laws of each country.

They say that everyone will be fascinated by Peru, and all travelers are impressed by its geographical and cultural variety, beautiful colors, and the great mysteries of the Inca people. As the land of the Incas, Peru was the center of a great civilization that once ruled a large part of South America. It left behind mysterious cities and places such as Machu Picchu, Cusco and the Sacred Valley where we will visit and see the relics of this ancient civilization.

Peru also offers wonderful shopping opportunities. In Lima, Cusco and Pisac the best quality and value lies in handcrafted products such as alpaca garments and tapestries, gold, silver, copper work, along with pre-Columbian ceramics. And there are many native markets along the Sacred Valley offering all sorts of handicrafts.

The highlights of our tour will be the visit to Machu Picchu, South America's most spectacular archaeological site and the Sacred Valley which is also spectacular. Only 100 years ago on July 24 1911, Hiram Bingham announced the discovery of Machu Picchu to scholars. Bingham had been searching for the city of Vilcabamba, the last Inca refuge during the Spanish conquest. He had worked for years in previous trips and explorations around the zone. Pablito Alvarez, a local 11 year-old Quechua boy, led Bingham up to Machu Picchu.

Perched on a mountain crest 10,000 feet above the dark green Amazon cloud forest, Machu Picchu is one of the world's most dramatic sites. Outside of a few local people, Machu Picchu's existence was unknown until American historian Hiram Bingham accidentally stumbled upon it in 1911. Much about Machu Picchu is still a mystery but the abundance of ornamental sites and the quality stonework indicates that it was an important ceremonial center.

In the Sacred Valley we will visit Pisac high above the valley floor and patch-worked by patterned fields. The stonework and panoramas at Pisac's Inca citadel are magnificent. Terraces, water ducts and steps were cut out of solid rock, and in the upper sector of the ruins, the main Sun Temple is equal to anything at Machu Picchu. Pisac also has a busy marketplace and interesting shopping.

Reasonably priced, this program is very comprehensive and just about everything is included for your enjoyment. A brief description of what's included follows:

### Your itinerary

**Day 1. (D) This evening we travel from Miami to Lima where we stay at the Jose Antonio Executive Hotel.**

Our flight will take about six hours and meals will be served aloft. Upon arrival, we will be transferred to our hotel, a full service hotel with all the amenities to make your stay comfortable.

### About Peru

Whatever you do in Peru, it will change you. The mystery of antiquity against the majestic Andes Mountains draws you along different and lost paths of human development. Lying entirely in the tropics, Peru is South America's third largest country. Thanks to the excellent preservation of its warm and arid climate, Peru offers an abundance of archeological and cultural experiences for the sophisticated traveler to savor. Visiting Peru's ancient ruins is one of the joys of touring, even for experienced travelers. The ancient Incan civilization is just the start of it all because the Incan people were preceded for thousands of years by pre-Columbian civilizations. And each civilization imposed its own values as the Spanish finally did when they conquered the Inca's. The colonial period of Spain left a legacy of buildings, artifacts and culture to visit and enjoy.

**Day 2 (B,D) This morning we attend to our professional agenda and meet with Peruvian lawyers at the Supreme Court. Later, we sightsee in Lima. Tonight we socialize at a welcome dinner. Jose Antonio Executive Hotel.**

This morning we meet with Peruvian lawyers at the Supreme Court in Lima. Later we take in the sights of colonial and modern Lima and see the city's historic sites. Among the places we visit are: San Marin and other major squares, the Cathedral, the Government Palace, the V Convent of San Francisco and its catacombs, and residential San Isidro and Milaflores. This evening we socialize at a welcome dinner.

### About Lima

Lima, located 7 miles from the Pacific coast, is Peru's modern bustling capital. Francisco Pizarro designed Lima's streets when he founded it in 1535. The city has kept its charming past and offers rich cultural and artistic traditions. Known as the "Three

Crowned City", Lima retains Pizarro's original city plan and has many colonial buildings to see and visit. As the former center of Spanish South America, it retains fine colonial architecture and treasures from all over the Peru can be found in its museums.

**Day 3. (B,D) We travel to Cusco, the oldest continuously inhabited city in the Western Hemisphere. It's 10,900 feet above sea level. Tonight we enjoy dinner at a local restaurant. Jose Antonio Cusco Hotel.**

This morning we fly over the Andes to Cusco, the gateway to Machu Picchu. The rest of the morning is free to enable us to adjust to the altitude. In the afternoon we take a tour to the Imperial City and visit the nearby ruins: Kenko, a ritual site with underground galleries and a semicircular amphitheater, Puca Pucara, a military installation made up of stairways, terraces and large walls, Tambomachay or Inca baths, was apparently a site dedicated to the worship of water and a resting place for the Inca monarch, and Sacsayhuaman, an imposing example of Inca military architecture. Tonight we dine at a folklore restaurant.

### About Cusco

Cusco, the oldest inhabited city of the Americas and a jewel of Inca and colonial architecture, is the city most tourists want to visit. When Columbus arrived in the Americas, Cusco was the thriving capital of the Inca Empire. Set in a valley high in the Southern Andes, Cusco combines its Incan legacy with



its outstanding Spanish colonial architecture. Cusco was the center of the Inca Empire and awe-inspiring sites Sacsayhuaman, Tampa Machay, Chinchero, Pisac and Ollantaytambo overlook the surrounding countryside.

Its inherited Andean culture remains alive with its colorful dress, exquisite weaving, hectic markets and traditional fiestas.

**Day 4. (B,L) Today we visit Machu Picchu “Lost City of the Incas,” the most famous archaeological site in South America.**

**Jose Antonio Cusco Hotel.**

This morning we take a Vistadome train through the sacred Urubamba Valley to Machu Picchu, the lost city of the Incas. We will have a full day to visit this lost city. Among the sights we’ll see are the Caretaker of the Funerary Rock, the Inca Bridge, the Intihuatana (the major shrine of Machu Picchu) and its Sun Dial where the high priests told the seasons. Later, we return to Cusco by train.

**About Machu Picchu**

Machu Picchu was unknown and forgotten for four hundred years until American historian Hiram Bingham discovered it by accident in 1911. Perched on a mountain crest 10,000 feet above the dark green Amazon cloud forest, Machu Picchu is one of the world’s most dramatic sites. Despite many expeditions and studies, little is still known about this mysterious place today. But it is clear by the abundance of ornamental sites and quality of stonework, that Machu Picchu was an important ceremonial center in Incan civilization.

**Day 5. (B,L) We tour the Sacred Valley, the heartland of the last Incas, home to the awe-inspiring fortresses of Sacsayhuaman and Ollantaytambo and the colorful market at Pisac.**

**Along our way we will have lunch at a hacienda.**

**Jose Antonio Cusco Hotel.**

This morning we depart for the drive through the fertile countryside making our way through the "Sacred Valley" of Urubamba. We drive to the Spanish Colonial village of Pisac and bargain with local artisans for Peruvian handicrafts: jewelry and great bargains on Alpaca sweaters. We continue through the valley to the picturesque village of Ollantaytambo with its seven rose-colored monoliths which puzzle scientists, who say the stone is not from the valley (or this World). The ruins are the most impressive stonework in Peru. Along our way we will see Calca, Yukay and Urubamba, a bustling place with strong Indian flavor. **Incidentally**, Ollantaytambo is still inhabited by its ancient people.

We have lunch at Tunipa Restaurant, a hacienda style villa that provides a beautiful experience with a fantastic selection of food. You will be delighted by the gorgeous views of the Urubamba River and the dramatic mountainous landscapes.

**Day 6.(B,D) We return to Lima. There is time to wrap up our professional agenda or for shopping.**

**Day 7. (B) This morning we visit the U.S. Embassy for a briefing about Peru. The reswt of the day is free. Tonight there is a farewell dinner at our Hotel.**

**Day 8. (B) This morning we board our return flight to Miami, arriving in Miami in the early evening.**

This morning we board our connecting flight to Miami. Meals will be served aloft. We arrive in Miami in the early evening.
